



# Woman and Child Abuse MA

The world leading Child and Woman Abuse Unit (CWASU) offers this specialist masters degree aimed at those working in services for women and children who have experienced violence, in policy making or delivery at local, regional or national levels, or for new entrants wishing to establish careers in these sectors.

## Why study this course?

The course is ideal for those who are working in specialised services for women and children, in policy-making or delivery at local, regional or national levels, or anyone wanting to establish careers in these sectors.

## Course structure

The course comprises of four core modules, a further two optional modules, and a dissertation.

Core modules:

- Violence Against Women: Issues, Research and Policy
- Sexual Violence: Causes, Consequences and Interventions
- Sexual Exploitation of Children and Young People
- Researching Violence and Evaluating Interventions

## Entry requirements

You will be required to have:

- a good honours degree in a relevant subject
- extensive relevant professional experience may be acceptable if you do not have sufficient academic qualifications

If you don't meet the entry criteria for the MA you have the option of taking a core module as a short course and on successful completion of assessments, you can then apply to join the MA.

## Studying with CWASU

We also offer the following:

- Postgraduate Certificate, or Diploma in Woman and Child Abuse
- Our core modules can be taken as individual short courses

## Career opportunities

Our graduates have gone on to key roles in policymaking or service delivery at local, regional and national levels, and some pursue further studies to PhD level, including with the Child and Woman Abuse Studies Unit.
